RIVER CITY HIGH SCHOOL Senior Year Contract 2018-2019

(You MUST return this form in order to participate in Homecoming, and all subsequent dances and Senior activities)

Congratulations Senior Raiders! There is an exciting year ahead of you, but remember that your goal is to graduate College, Career or Military ready, so pay attention to everything this year and stay on top of your grades and all graduation requirements, (this include Service Learning!) throughout the entire year. To help guide you to a successful Senior year, the following expectations in regards to behavior and attendance should be on your mind with every decision you make. It is our hope that by setting clear expectations and boundaries, you will be able to make sound choices.

ATTENDANCE

The Washington Unified School District maintains a goal of 97% attendance for all students. We expect you to attend school every day. You must maintain a **year-long attendance average of 90%** or better to be able to participate in senior events. This is a firm figure. Senior events, which include Prom, the graduation ceremony, the senior trip, and Senior Sunset depend on your attendance.

TARDIES

We also expect that you will get to your classes on time. You must maintain a 95% on-time percentage for the school year. This means that seniors must have less than 36 tardies to all their classes combined for the entire school year. When averaged out, seniors must have an average of less than 1 tardy a week to all classes to be eligible for senior events.

DISCIPLINE

Students that have received any disciplinary action of any sort are at risk for not being able to participate in senior activities, including Senior Sunset, senior trip, and graduation; however, they will still receive their diploma.

CONSEQUENCES

Students unable to maintain acceptable attendance/tardies/behavior expectations will become ineligible for participation in senior events and will be referred to the Senior Review Board. The Senior Review Board meets with students to review any extenuating circumstances which may allow participation in graduation and/or senior trip **IF** the student's appeal is granted.

SENIOR TRIP AND GRADUATION

All students who complete the Washington Unified School District Board of Education requirements for graduation and meet attendance/tardy/behavior requirements are invited to join their class on the Senior Trip and for the graduation ceremony, unless notified by an administrator prior to the event.

SENIOR TRIP

The Senior Trip for the Class of 2019 will take place on **May 31, 2019**. To be eligible to attend, senior students must meet the following requirements:

- Seniors must be on track to completing 220 credits, passing all required classes for graduation, and must have completed ALL service learning projects for grades 9-12.
- Seniors must maintain 90% attendance average for the school year and maintain a 95% on-time percentage to all classes all year.
- Students must not have any severe disciplinary incidents on his/her record. "Severe" shall be defined as habitual/repeated offenses, suspensions, expulsion proceedings, or other major violations of school rules which would preclude participation in an off-campus event.
- All debts must be paid to the school bookkeeper (no money owed for school events, fundraisers, lost library books, etc.)
- Students who have paid for the Senior Trip, but who lose the right to attend as a result of poor behavior or attendance issues, will not receive a refund unless the outside agency agrees.
- Students who do not qualify for senior trip are expected to attend school. Failure to attend school may result in a loss of graduation privileges. All absences due to illness will require a doctor's verification.

GRADUATION CEREMONY

The graduation ceremony will take place on **Wednesday**, **June 5**, **2018**, at 7:00 pm at Raley Field and will provide a program of both reflective and celebratory moments focused on the class and its accomplishments. Graduates and their guests are expected to take this ceremony seriously and respect each senior's moment as he/she receives a diploma. Likewise, it is anticipated that each person in attendance will be attentive, respectful and courteous to speakers and recipients. *There will be a \$5 parking fee at Raley Field for this event.*

GRADUATION PRACTICE

Graduation practice is a mandatory event for all seniors and will take place on **Tuesday**, **June 4**, **2019**, **at 2:30 pm**, in the River City gym. **Students** who miss practice will forfeit their right to walk at graduation AND their graduation tickets.

GRADUATION TICKETS

Tickets will be distributed after the graduation practice on Tuesday, June 4, 2019, at approximately 3:30 pm. Students who miss practice will forfeit their right to walk at graduation AND their graduation tickets.

GRADUATION EXPECTATIONS

To ensure proper decorum and to make sure each student looks their best for the momentous occasion of graduation, the following guidelines will be enforced:

- Students must wear formal attire underneath their gown: dress, skirt, or dress pants and blouse, or dress slacks, dress shirts, tie and dress shoes
- Any senior who has a question about appropriate dress or may have difficulty in obtaining the appropriate attire should contact their counselor or administrator. They can assist you in obtaining the appropriate attire.
- All graduates must wear caps and gowns. Caps and gowns are available to be purchased online or at various points during the school year. Caps and gowns can also be borrowed. If you wish to borrow a gown, please sign up in the AP office with Deanna. Nothing may be affixed to the caps other than the tassel; nothing may be affixed to the gown.
- Inflatable objects are not permitted in Raley Field and may result in the graduate's removal from the ceremony.
- Graduates may bring only their programs/bottled water into the seating area. It is highly recommended that no purses or bags be brought to the ceremony as there will not be any provision made for storing them or other valuables during the ceremony. The school is not responsible for lost or stolen articles.
- In addition, graduates will not be able to hold any balloons, flowers, leis, or any other decoration on the gown. Please save all momentos for after graduation outside of Raley Field.
- All school, district and state regulations regarding alcohol, tobacco, drugs, and weapons will be enforced in order to ensure the safety of graduates and their guests.
- All obligations including, but not limited to, detention, bills, fines, etc. must be paid and/or cleared prior to school check-out in order to be eligible to participate in the ceremony.
- Graduates will not be able to meet with any family member inside the stadium. Graduates are directed immediately after the conclusion of the ceremony to the right field exit gate. No one is to remain inside the stadium for any length of time after the ceremony has concluded.

While attending senior events, I fully understand that I am expected to conduct myself in a dignified manner and represent my school and myself responsibly and appropriately. My participation in senior events is **optional**, is a privilege, and not a right. I understand and agree to the expectations as described above. In addition, my parent or guardian has also read the contract and we have discussed it in its entirety.
