Option 3: The Essay

Write a 1-page (12 pt font, Times New Roman, double spaced, 1" margins) essay of your findings, focusing on the question: Why is volunteering or public service important?

This counts for FOUR service learning hours.

Option 4: The Slide Deck

Interview or research someone local (the greater Sacramento area) that is heavily involved in Community Service, local government or is running a non-profit organization. Create a 3-5 slide presentation, focusing on the question: Why is volunteering or public service important?

This counts for FOUR service learning hours.
