Clarence Gideon's Road to the Supreme Court

Many people don't realize that, in the past, those arrested for a crime did not really have "the right to an attorney" unless they had money. This became a right because Clarence Earl Gideon, a prison inmate who did not have the money for a lawyer, took pencil in hand and wrote his own petition to the United States Supreme Court. Clarence Gideon, without a lawyer, took his case to the highest court in the country and won important rights for all of us. Gideon's Trumpet is his story.

- 7. Our court systems handle criminal cases and civil cases. In *Gideon v. Wainwright* the Supreme Court ruled that "if you cannot afford an attorney, one will be appointed for you by the court," but that this right only applies if you are a defendant in a criminal case, NOT if you are a defendant in a civil case. Why? Explain. Should a defendant in a civil case be entitled to representation? Explain.
