Prosecution Closing Argument - Sample outline using the MOM format

I. Introduction

A. Thank the jury

B. Repeat the theme developed in the opening statement.

C. Remind the jury of the theory your colleague stated in her opening statement. Suggest no other reasonable explanation has emerged through this trial but guilty beyond a reasonable doubt

- D. Talk about totality of evidence
- E. Define the crime, use the language of the statute (Penal Code Section)

F. Tell the real story

II. MOM - Means, Opportunity, Motive

A. Means

1. Review the evidence that proves that the defendant had the ability to commit the crime

2. Tie each item to the elements of the crime where possible

B. Opportunity

1. Review the evidence that proves that the defendant had the opportunity to commit the crime. This may include:

- 1. Time
- 2. Lack of an alibi
- 3. Witnesses who saw Def or place Def somewhere
- 4. Couldn't be in two places at once?

C. Motive

1. Define the potential reasons that the defendant committed the crime

2. Remember: motive isn't required, INTENT is. They are not the same. Use motive to help to get to intent. Motive is about "why" someone does something.

3. Intent is the decision or determination to break the law. Intent is about "knowing" what they're doing is wrong and they do it anyway.

III. Repeat request for guilty verdict

A. Acknowledge the burden of proof, but insist that the totality of the evidence leaves no reasonable doubt

B. Reiterate the theme

C. Ask that the jury come back with the only verdict supported by the evidence – guilty of ______

D. Thank the jury (or the judge)
